Dear Mr. Wooten:

Please find enclosed a copy of WSDA Case Investigation Summary Section A and B. The investigation conducted by Ed Von Grey found that CW3RC (Arlie Clinkenbeard) used the herbicide Rodeo in a backpack sprayer without adding a surfactant. A Notice of Correction has been issued to Mr. Clinkenbeard for the off label use. A letter has also been sent to the U.S. Forest Service for them to review their use of Rodeo in that adding a surfactant is required by label for certain methods of application.

According to RCW 43.05.100 (2) a Notice of Correction is not a formal enforcement action, is not subject to appeal, and is a public record.

Investigator Findings / Recommendations

- Commercial Applicator Arlie Clinkenbeard said he used a hand-held pump sprayer to spray glyphosate, the active
 ingredient of Rodeo, on the majority of the U.S. Forest Service Boulder Creek riparian area herbicide application sites.
- 2. Clinkenbeard did not add surfactant because it was not addressed in the project's environmental assessment.
- 3. The Rodeo label requires the use of a nonionic surfactant in hand-held equipment.
